### 1. Call AAL-2008-1

This report presents statistics to the first call under the AAL Joint Programme entitled "**ICT based solutions for Prevention and Management of Chronic Conditions of Elderly People**". The call was published on 25 April with a deadline on 21 August 2008. The call had an indicative total funding of 57.7 Mio € that was committed by 25 national funding authorities from 23 AAL Partner States and the European Commission.

The statistics are first presented to all submitted proposals (chapter 2), followed by those projects that passed all evaluation thresholds (chapter 3).

#### Please note:

In the course of the clarification and negotiation phase, a substantial number of positively evaluated proposals could finally not be considered for funding, mostly for reasons of budget scarcity in one or more AAL Partner States and sometimes for reasons of partner withdrawals on the side of the consortia.


23 proposals (i.e. 19.5% of all submitted proposals) were finally selected for funding under call 1. Statistics for these projects will be added as soon as the required range of data is finally available.

### 2. Submitted proposals

118 projects were received in response to the call and only proposal failed to meet the central eligibility criteria and was consequently not evaluated but is included in this statistical analysis. The following table and charts indicate more details of the received proposals:





Chart 2: Coordinators per country in submitted proposals











Chart 3: Budget figures for submitted proposals













Chart 8: No. of organisations in ranked proposals per country

Chart 9: No. of coordinators in ranked proposals per country






Chart 10: Budget figures in ranked proposals per country








Chart 12: Organisation types in the 56 ranked proposals (N=452)





Read: Countries as the Netherlands, United Kingdom and Norway could strengthen their participation in positively evaluated proposals. Luxembourg and Poland lost relative project partners. Please note that for some countries, the reference basis is low (see table 2 on previous page).






Chart 14: Change of enterprises against all participating organisations

Read: The relative participation of Austrian enterprises slightly increased (all values > 1) in the set of positively evaluated proposal against all submitted proposals. French enterprises lost parts of their relative share. In Cyprus, no enterprise was involved in the call. The high Danish result is due to the fact that 3 from 4 enterprises made it to the list of the positively evaluated proposals whereas the non-enterprise partners from Denmark came down from 6 to 1.
