1.1 OVERVIEW

The main objective of this deliverable is the implementation of the working backend and middleware layer of Elder-Spaces platform which supports the frontend development on multiple platforms of the site's basic functionalities and the applications, and serves data for the Social Search module.

The specifications of all the entities and services implemented in the middleware are provided in WP2. The implemented backend and middleware layers satisfy the requirements we made in WP1 and supports the further frontend developments of WP4 and WP5.

1.6 OPERATIONAL INFORMATIONS OF ELDER-SPACES SERVER

1.6.1 DOMAIN

Elder-Spaces back-end and middleware is served by two Dom0 domains:

- `vm-e1.iwiw.hu`
- `vm-e2.iwiw.hu`

1.6.2 LOADBALANCING

Elder-Spaces platform is designed for high availability, to serve many concurrent users at the same time. In order to meet this requirement, we utilize multiple servers to support the platform. These servers execute specified functions, that we filter by the URL of the requests. This filtering and task allocation is the job of the loadbalancer.

In case of Elder-Spaces platform, the loadbalancing is served by a Cisco ACE loadbalancer with HAProxy, which is a free HTTP and TCP loadbalancing service.

The loadbalancer:

- `lb.origoapps.iwiw.hu:80`

This is the loadbalancer of the API and the frontend applications. It monitors the 80 port and directs the requests to the right backends




Figure 1 - Elder-Spaces topology
