

4.1 Brochure in English



The aim of the Toilet For Me Too project (T4Me2) is to develop a flexible toilet for use in public and semi-public space that can be used autonomously by older and disabled people when going out. The designed toilet is approachable, clean, safe and easy to use.

We are working on a toilet system with ICTbased, adaptive physical stand-up and control support with integrated safety features. It will allow people with movement or mobility restrictions, who currently require human assistance, to use the toilet independently and safely. This is the next step towards barrier-free toilets in public spaces for the disabled and elderly.
